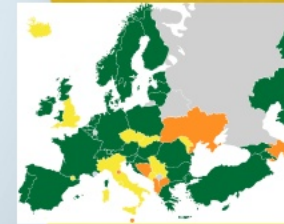

- common standards for QA, built for the European Higher Education Area (EHEA)
- Register to demonstrate substantial compliance with the ESG
- EQAR-registration is a trusted status, guarantee to the public

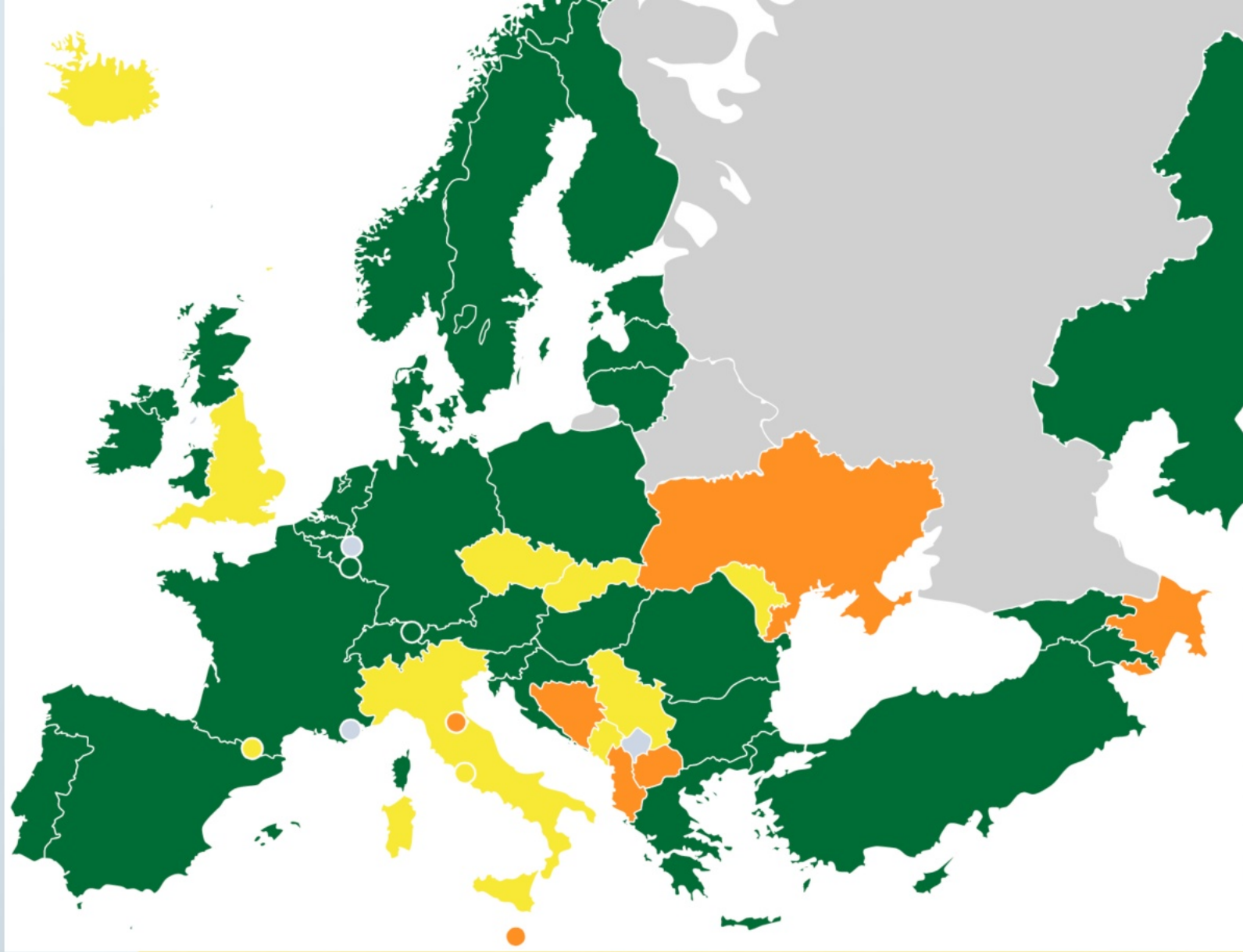

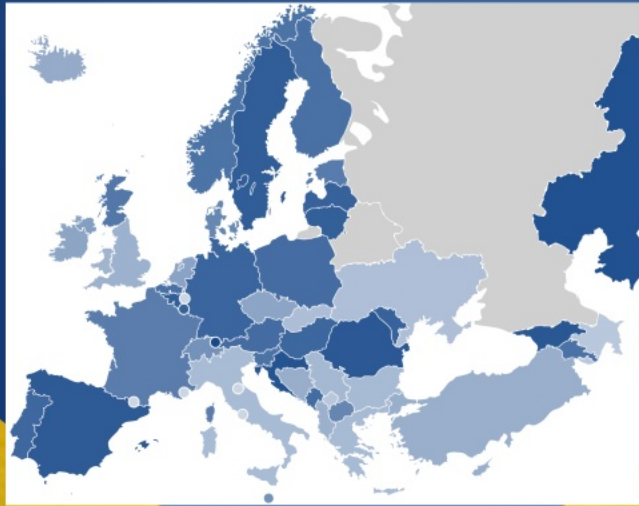
Towards cross-border QA

- ministers recognise HEI's responsibility for assuring the quality of education (Berlin 2003)
- over 300 types of QA activities aligned with the ESG, successfully employed across the EHEA
- ESG considered suitable basis for work across borders.
- ministerial commitments for cross-border recognition (Bucharest 2012) and HEIs right to choose a suitable EQAR-registered agency (Yerevan 2015 and Paris 2018)

- 82 776 reports
- 3 487 institutions HEIs
- DEQAR contributing agencies cover 87% of the EHEA member countries



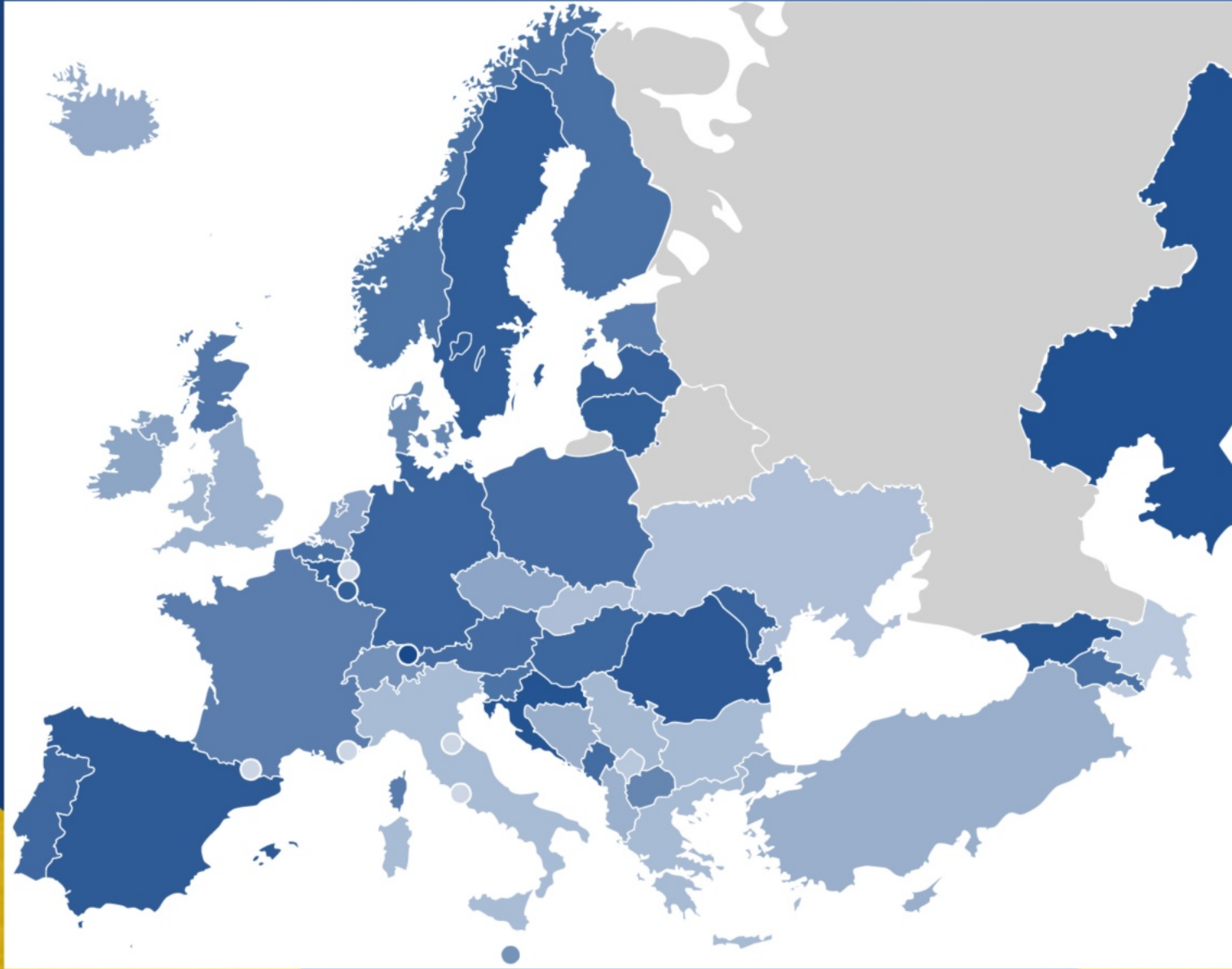

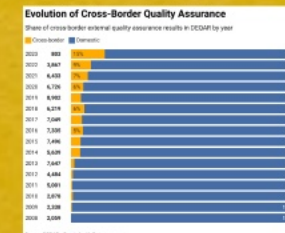

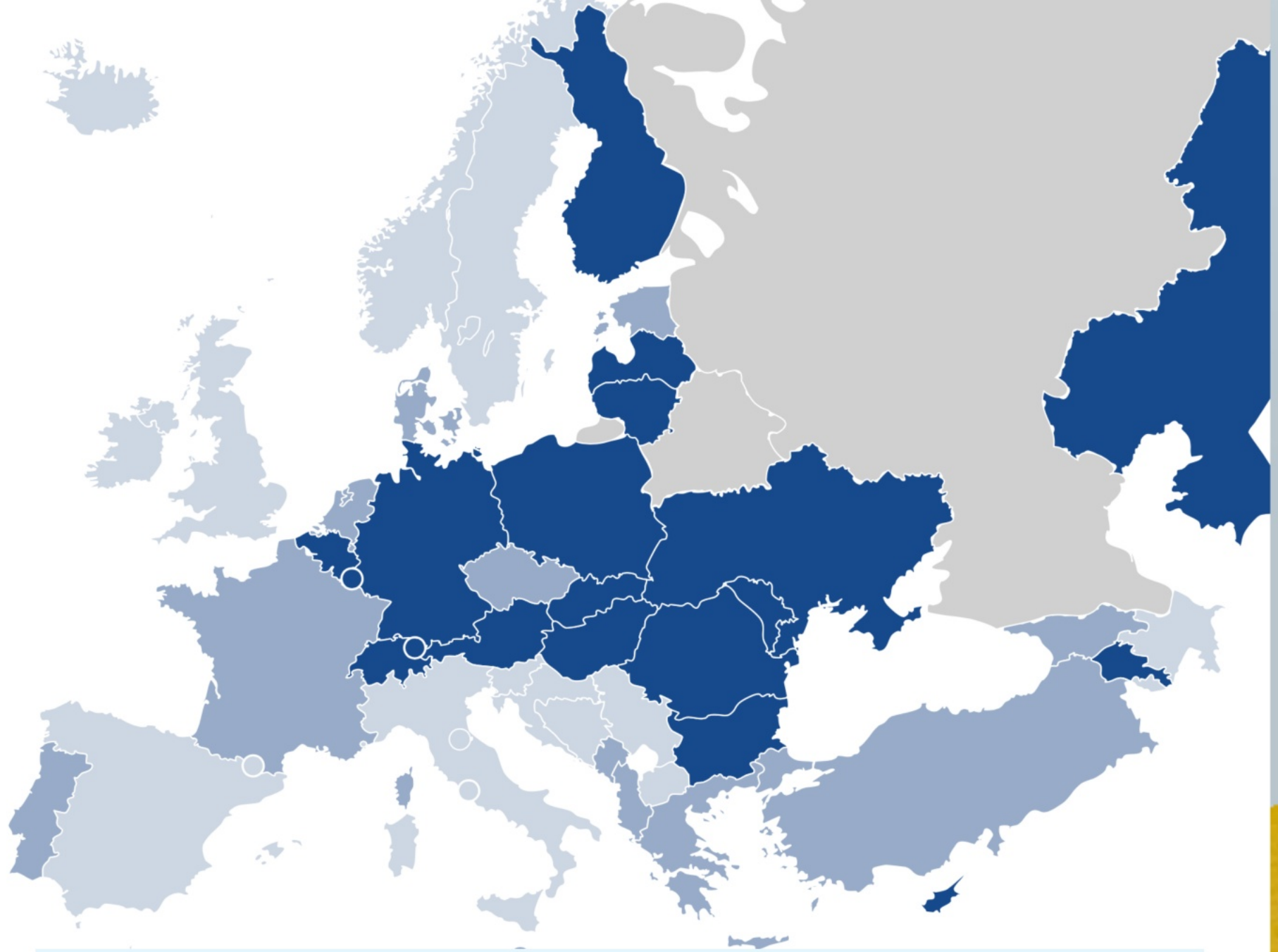
43 countries of the 47 EHEA members had at least one EQA by a foreign EQAR-listed agency (agencies participating in DEQAR)

The share of cross border QA procedures within EHEA is more common but increasing in recent years for non-EHEA regions.

CBQA activities within the EHEA mostly carried out within countries that have a legal framework recognising foreign EQAR-registered agencies, but 'openness' to such CBQA lagging behind.

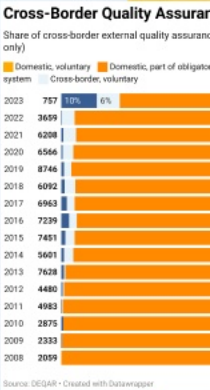


Level of official recognition of cross-border external QA (March 2023)

43 countries of the 47 EHEA members had at least one EQA by a foreign EQAR-listed agency (agencies participating in DEQAR)

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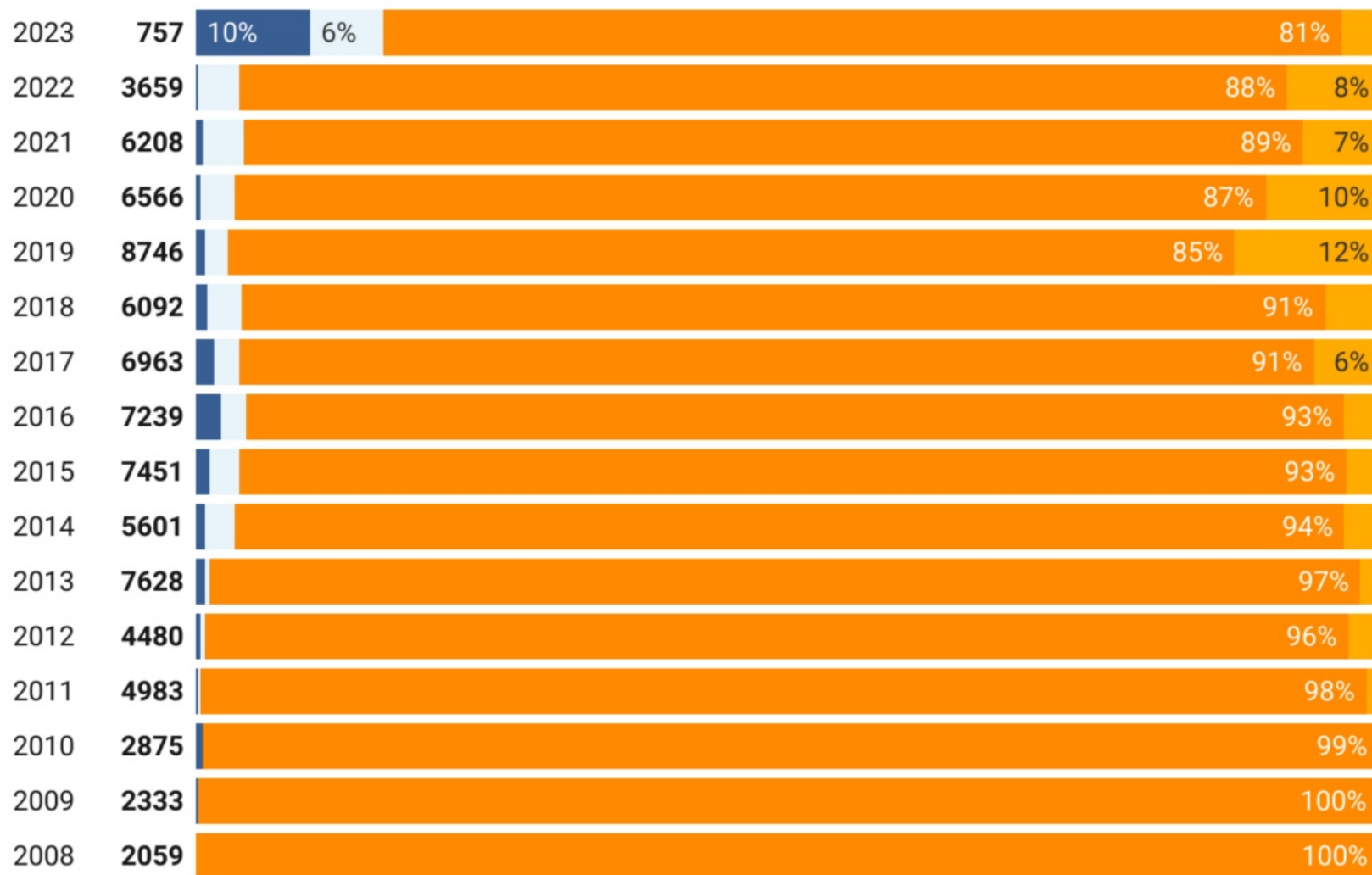

 ■ Cross-border, voluntary

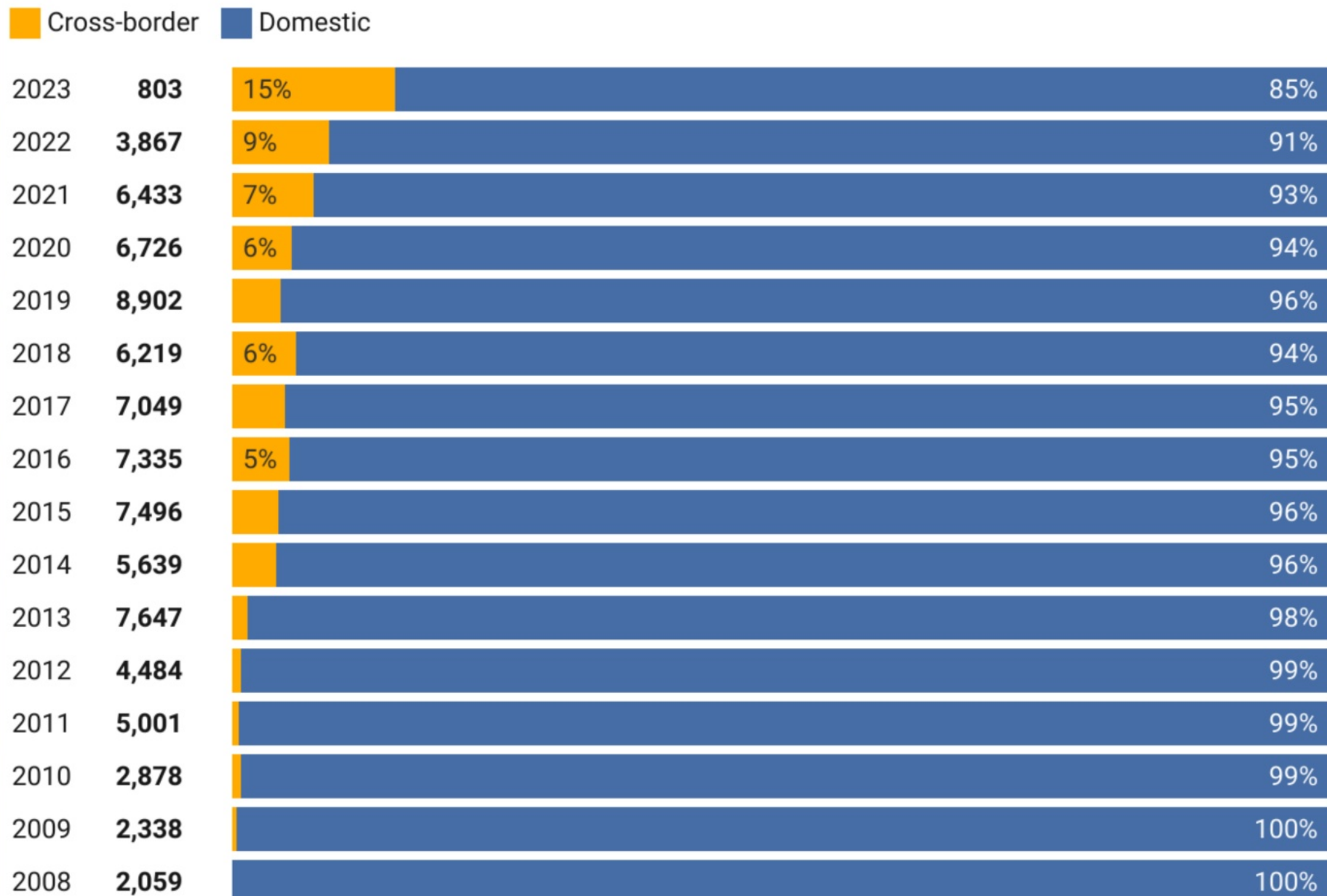

Share of cross-border external quality assurance results in DEQAR by year

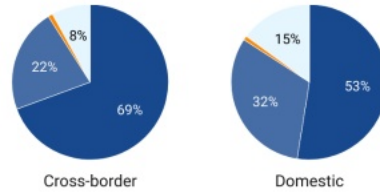

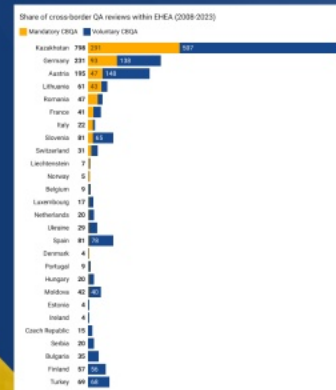

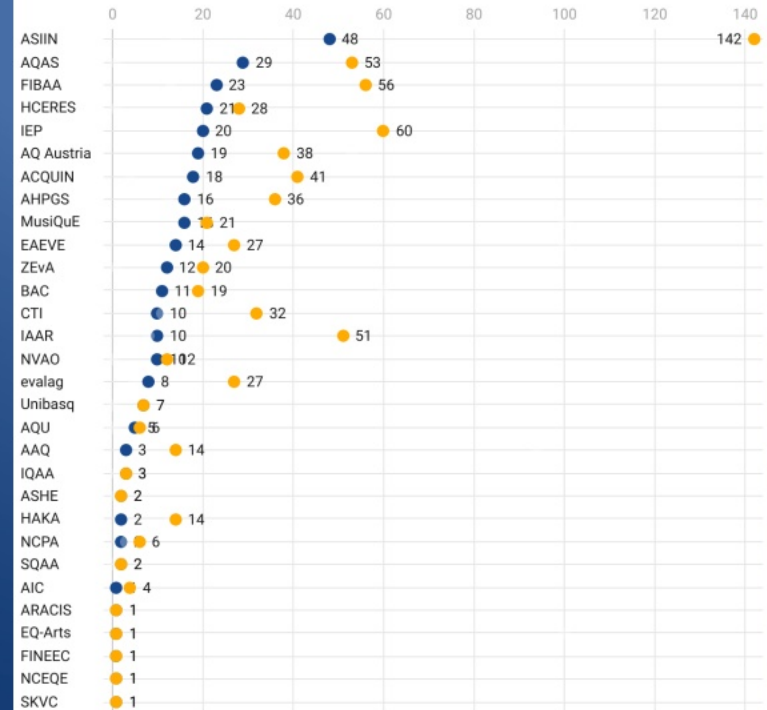

● No. of countries ● No. of HEIs covered

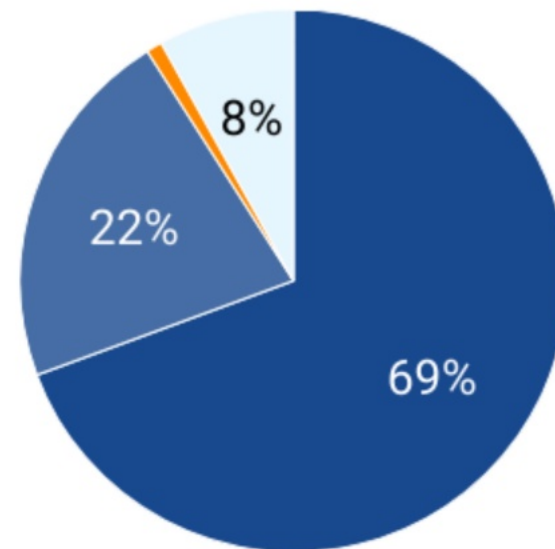
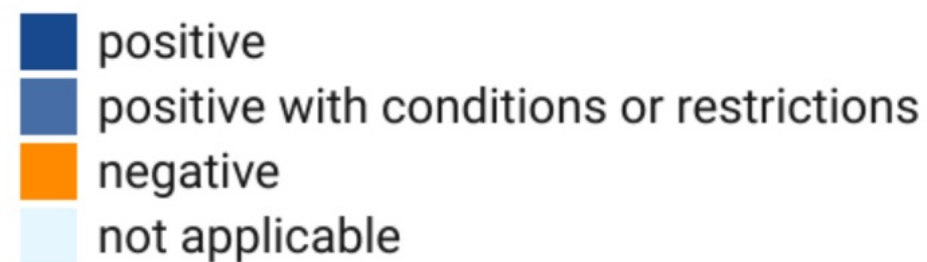


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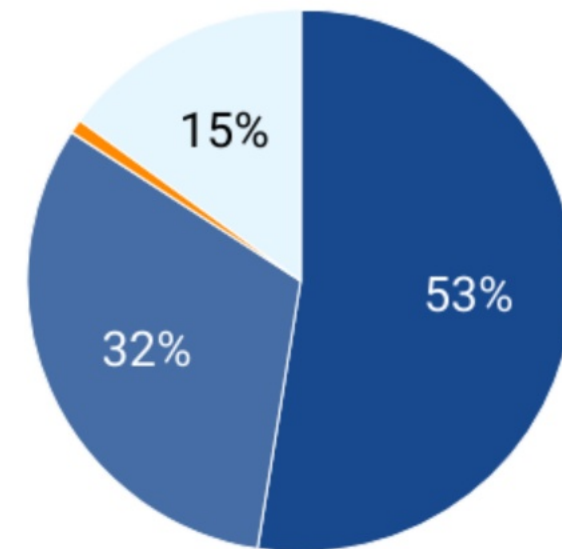
Cross-border QA of EQAR-registered agencies over time

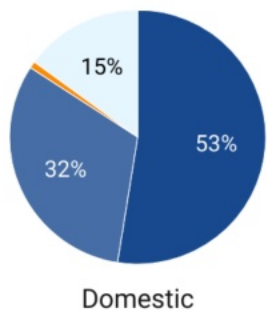

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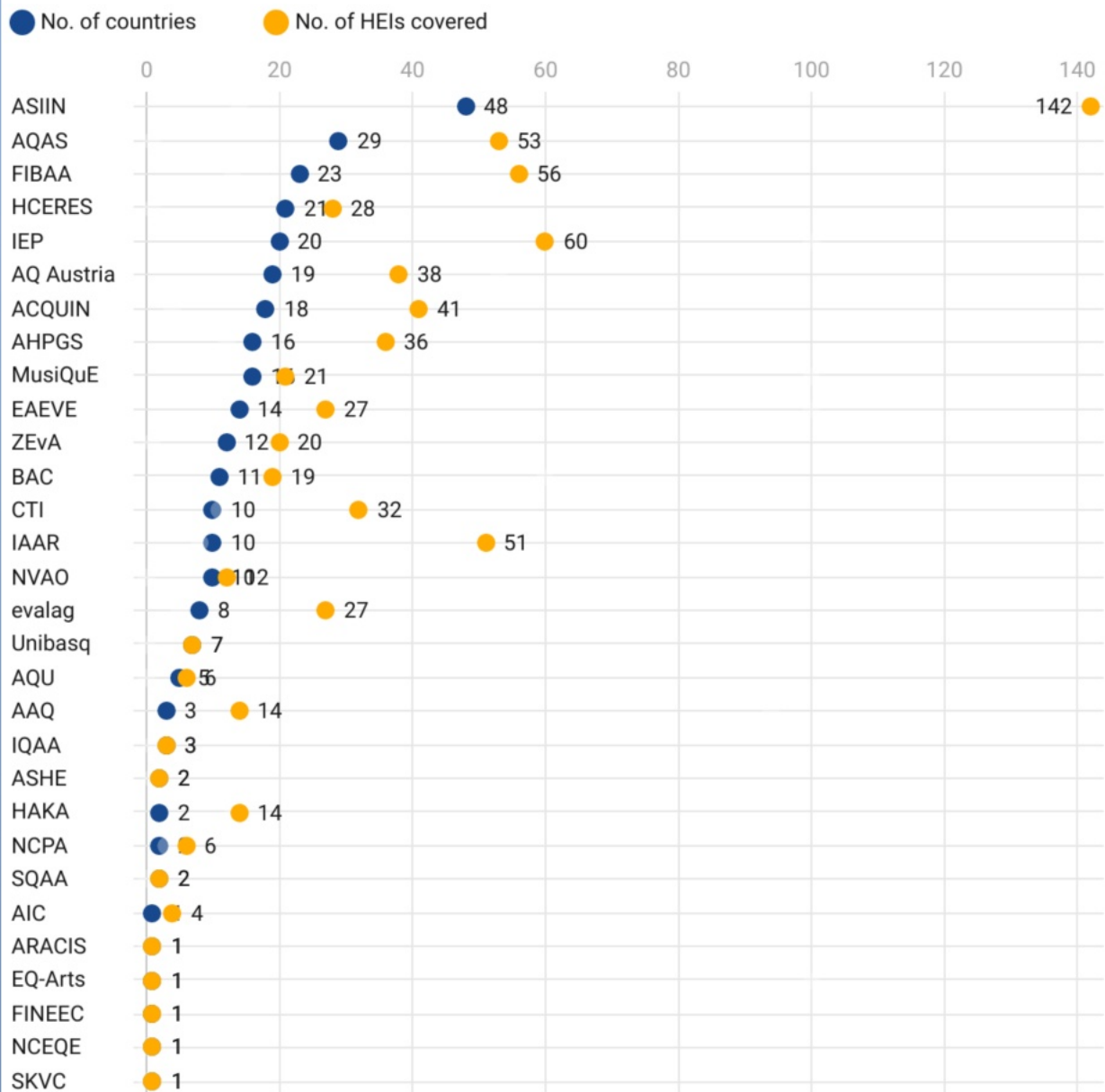

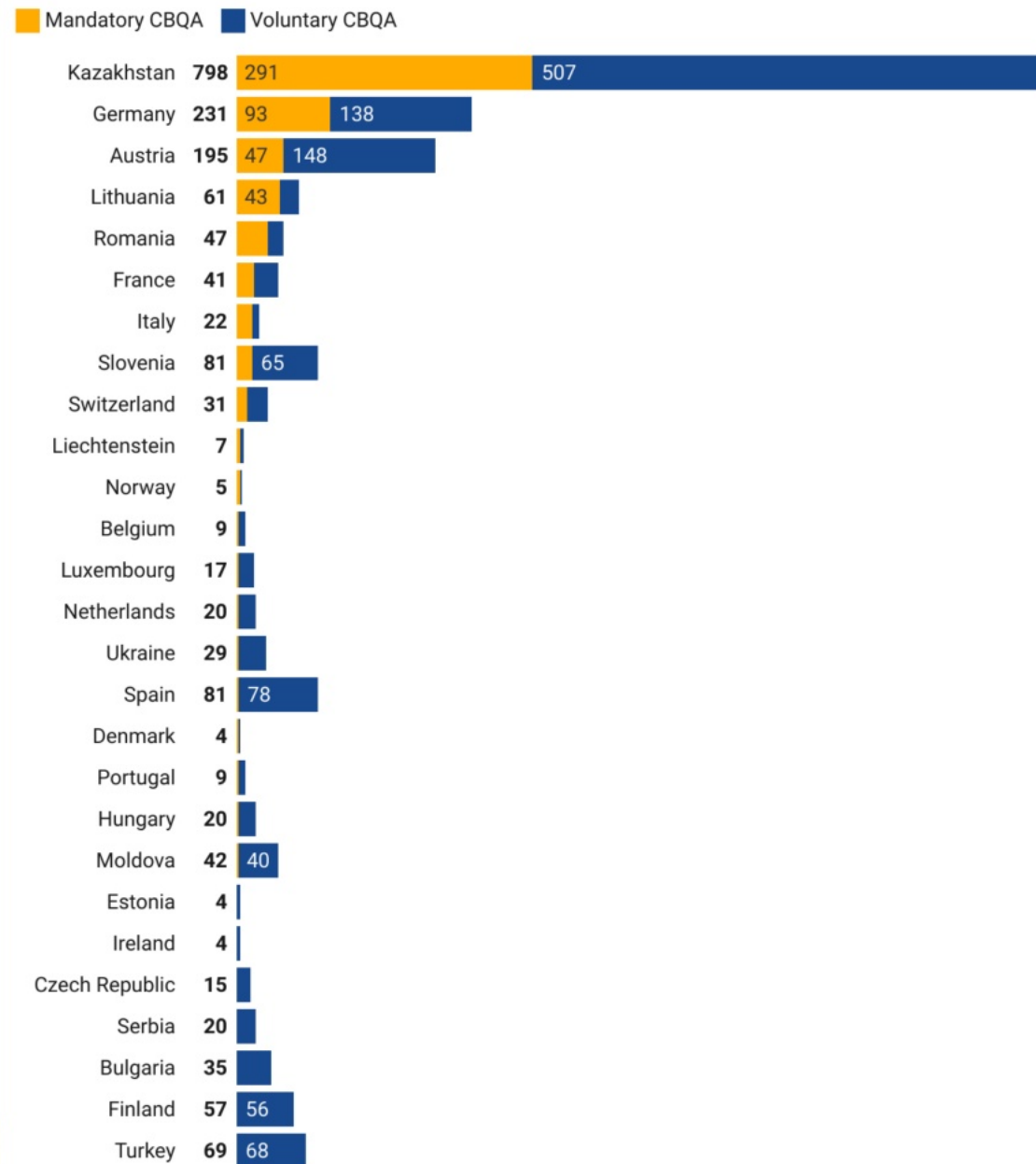
Cross-border external QA by no. of countries & HEIs

Main "importers" of cross-border external QA

Requirements for quality assurance agencies to operate in another country

1. **Eligibility requirements** e.g., approval by a competent national body
2. **Conditions for the agency's work** e.g., use the regulations and frameworks of the national higher education system
3. **System level limitations** e.g., only certain HEIs or programmes may use CBOQA
4. **Recognition of reviews** e.g. the approval of the report & decision by a competent national body or the national QA agency

Rationale for CBOQA

- enhance their reputation
- increase the employability of their graduates
- develop their own internal quality culture
- to fulfil the educational standards for specific EU regulated professions e.g., EAEVE review
- strengthen internationalisation policies
- increase external & internal acknowledgement of the institutions
- a way of attracting more students not from the national pool but also from abroad.

Choice of a QA agency

- usually involves considerable desk research (EQAR website, the portfolios of international activities and the presentation of QA agencies' procedures and cross-border review policies)
- important in their choice: the international reputation, country of origin, expertise in a particular field, affordability etc.

QA of TNE

TNE or CBHE = any learning activity in which the students are based in a different country from the country in which the institution providing the education is located

Rome Communiqué (2020)- national EQA arrangements should cover transnational higher education with equal standards to those used for domestic provision

TNE provision - a steady increase in the number of new TNE programmes being offered and in new forms of delivery

QA of TNE (DEQAR data)

At least 30 higher education institutions from 17 different EHEA systems have TNE provision in different higher education system



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
