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Historical Context – Bologna Reforms

Purpose of the Diploma Supplement = to Enhance Students' Employability

European requirements

- Issue Diploma Supplement free of charge
- All students on:
 - → Bachelor Degree
 - → Master's Degree
- Prescribed format

Assumptions

- Initially, paper document
- Restricted to Taught Programmes

No official encouragement for

- Electronic documents
- Diploma Supplement for research students

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Review by EC Advisory Group 4

Three main areas of work

- Template work ongoing
- Format of 'Document' Paper v e-Document questions include:
 - What is an e-Diploma Supplement best practice?
 - Can it be introduced internationally?
 - How can future technological achievements be accommodated?
 - What platforms should be used?
 - Compatibility with Student Records systems is essential
 - What are the views of and benefits to employers?
- Extension to **Doctoral Degrees**
 - Should there be a bespoke template?
 - What are the employability-related achievements?
 - Should it be an electronic document?

Doctoral Students' Diploma Supplement [DDS]

- Recommending extending the application of the Diploma Supplement to the 3 cycles (Bachelor, Master's and Doctoral degrees) and sharing good practice
 - \checkmark Sharing best practice the UK endorsed template = HEAR[R]

Future-proofing

• Considering further advancements e.g. e-badges, links to social media

Background – why is Swansea regarded as being innovative?

- One of the 1st UK universities to issue a Diploma Supplement to Master's and Bachelor students - by the 2005 target date
- Awarded Diploma Supplement Label in 2009 paper version
- Responded to students' requests by producing an electronic and paper version within the University
- 1st European university to be awarded Diploma Supplement Label for e-Diploma Supplement
- The only university to have been awarded a Diploma Supplement Label for a Higher Education Achievement Report (HEAR)

.....continued

- Students' Academic achievements, including the learning outcomes of the degree, are recorded
- Students' additional non-academic achievements, verified by the university, are recorded e.g. Swansea Employability Award, Student Ambassador award, prizes
- Employers have access to the data and can search and filter for potential employees
- Swansea has led on a UK project on developing a HEAR[R] for research students and has presented to the EUA-CDE

Requirements & Characteristics of the Swansea University e-Diploma Supplement, supported by *Gradintelligence*


- Compliance with the DS international standards
- A focus on data as well as documents to support and facilitate
 - evidencing academic and non academic achievements
 - evidencing mobility, placements and experience
 - transition to higher education Masters or Doctoral degrees
 - transition to employment
- Software easily adaptable for a range of source records systems
- A "live" reference tool, promoting students' engagement

The Electronic Diploma Supplement

Usage of e-data compared with restrictions of PDF / Paper

- \checkmark Accessibility by others and searchable by third parties
- ✓ Meets expectations of the younger generations eg mobile
- ✓ Maximises the potential of IT, social media (LinkedIn)
- \checkmark Digitally secured and verified by the university
- Data can be decoupled from the 'document format' & passed to other relevant services (e.g. LinkedIn, employer / HE institution applicant management systems...)
- ✓ A "live" motivational student reference tool

University lifecycle – not just an exit statement... most effective when used formatively



Compliant with European standards

 The Diploma Supplement / HEAR is the official record of students & graduates higher education achievements; the prescribed international template and UK criteria defined by the Measuring and Recording Student Achievement Steering Group (Burgess Group)

HIGHER EDUCATION ACHIEVEMENT REPORT (Diploma Supplement)

This Higher Education Achievement Report incorporates the model developed by the European Commission, Council of Europe and UNESCO/CEPES for the Diploma Supplement.

The purpose of the supplement is to provide sufficient recognition of qualifications (diplomas, degrees, certificates etc). It is designed to provide a description of the nature, level, context and status of the studies that were pursued and successfully completed by the individual named on the original qualifications to which this supplement is appended. It should be free from any value judgements, equivalence statements or suggestions about recognition. Information in all eight sections should be provided. Where information is not provided, an explanation should give the reason why.

In hard copy format this Higher Education Achievement Report is printed in black ink on paper watermarked with the creat of the University and carries the official University stamp. It is not valid unless in this format.¹





A hosted shared service that securely connects to university student records and achievement data sources to automate student registration, document upload and document management processes.







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



Swansea	Employability	Award	(SEA)

The Careers and Employability Service works in partnership with academic staff to provide the SEA for both undergraduate and postgraduate students.

The Swansea Employability Award helps you to explore who you are and then gain experience and develop skills. If you complete the SEA it will be recorded on your degree transcript.

There are two main modules to the SEA following registration, the first module is about finding out more about yourself, what you value in life, your personality type, learning styles, what jobs might suit you, then marketing yourself by creating a CV and covering letter. The module finishes with an interview with a Careters Adviser. The second module is about getting experiences. These experiences may follow on from the first module or they may be general experiences and can be work experiences, buttientering, positions of responsibility to name a few. Following the completion of these experiences you will have a mock job interview.
