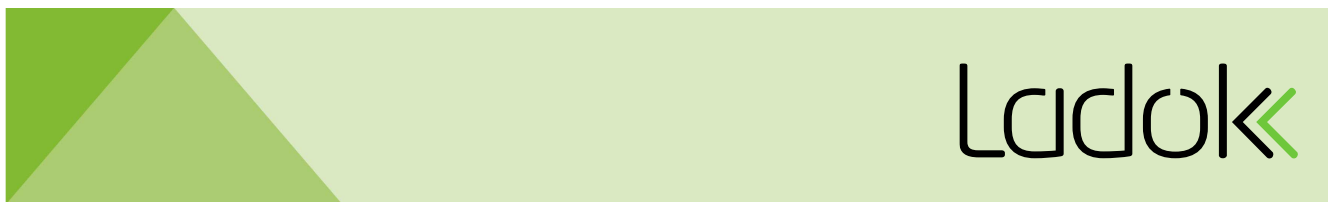
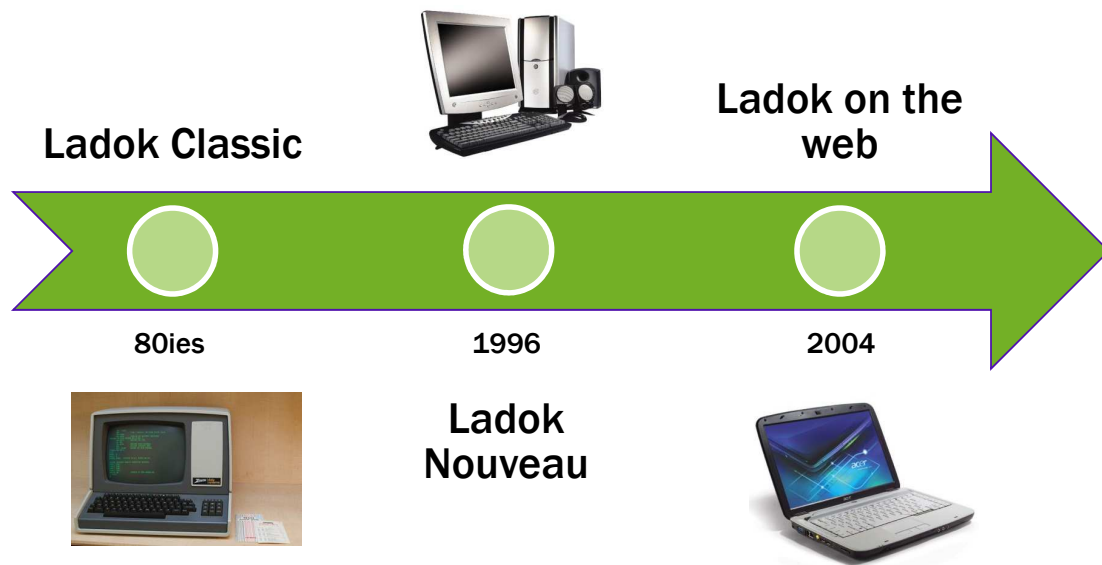

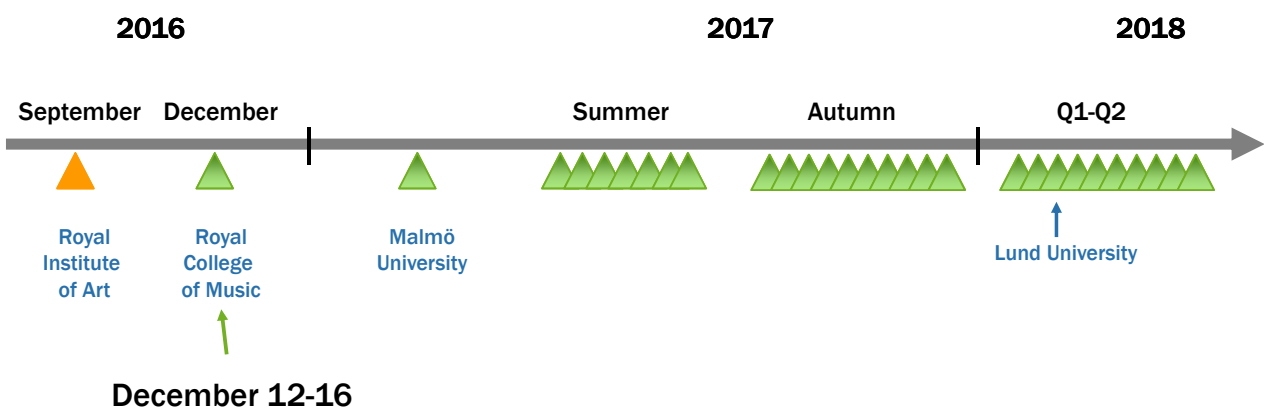

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What are the Obstacles to Student Mobility?

In the different phases of the decision process, different obstacles may deter students from studying abroad.

Financial and familial obstacles are of especially high relevance with regard to the initial decision to go abroad for study purposes.

Students who are already planning to study abroad are more concerned about practical matters: integrating a stay abroad into their study programme, getting relevant information, securing a place in a mobility programme, and ensuring their results achieved abroad will be recognised.

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What is EMREX?



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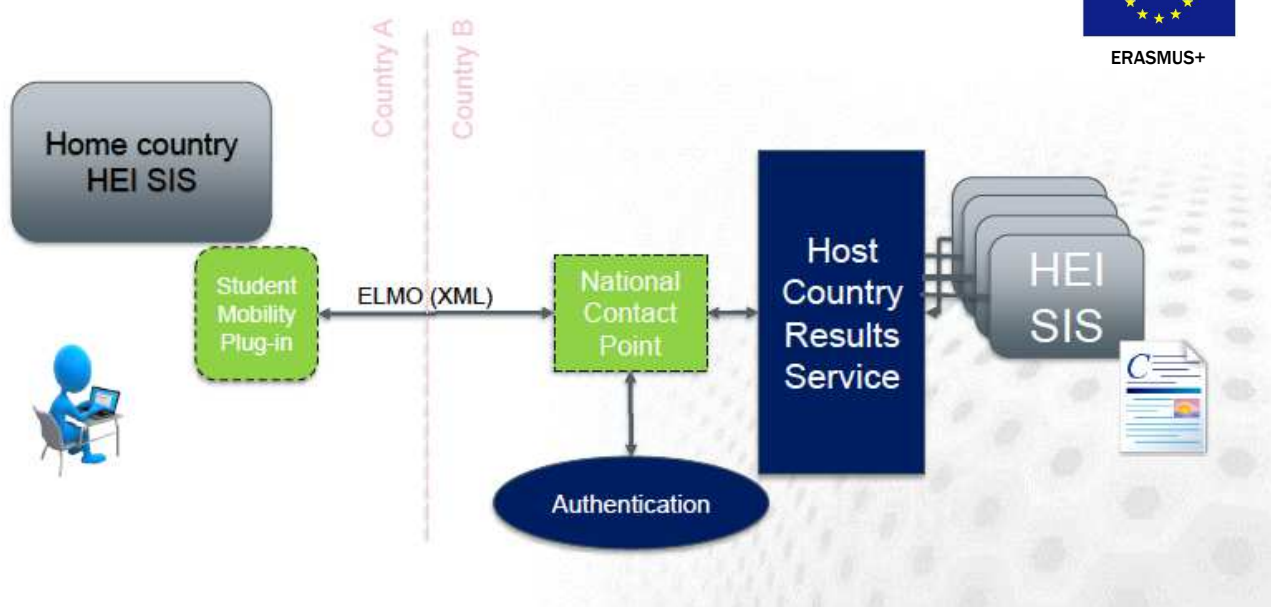
- Field trial on the impact of enabling easy mobility on recognition of external studies
