# Terms of Reference – Outcome/tasks fulfilled by May 2017 (+/- 2,000 characters)

The roadmap adopted during the Erevan Conference in 2015 is the basis used for the work of the advisory group. Progress made concerning the different issues of the roadmap is examined by the members of the group. Political meetings between Belarusian Parliamentarians and the German-Belarus parliamentarian group have been organised; peer-learning activities, seminars, and conferences on different areas have been organised with European and Belarusian stakeholders, HEIs, rectors, etc. Furthermore the members of the group meet regularly external independent stakeholders.

- To report to the BFUG on the state of play of implementation of the roadmap before the beginning of 2018.
