1 Confederation - 26 Cantons – 2396 communes


Economics:

 Primary Sector 1.2%, Secondary Sector 26.8%, Tertiary Sector 72% (% of GDP)



Swiss education system




Swiss education system High level of permeability



Federal Act on Funding and Coordination of the Swiss Higher Education Sector (Higher Education Act, HEdA)

Framework for high quality education and research came into force on the 1st January 2015.

- 3 types of higher education institutions in one single higher education landscape
 Cantonal Universities and Institutes of Technology ETH
 Universities of Applied Sciences
 Universities of Teacher Education
- facilitates mobility between the 3 types
- created joint bodies of the Confederation and the Cantons:
 to coordinate priorities and investment in cost-intensive fields

C Accreditation


Institutional Accreditation is mandatory

- for institutions wishing to use the reserved designations «university», «university of applied sciences» or «university of teacher education» or derived designations such as «university college» or «UAS college»
- ➢ for public universities in order to be eligible for federal contributions
- ➢ for programme accreditation

Programme Accreditation is voluntary

Validity of the accreditation: seven years

The Bologna Process and Switzerland

- Switzerland signed the Bologna Declaration in 1999
- Responsibility for the implementation by the Rectors' Conferences (closer to the field)
- This has led to:
 - a structural reform
 - \rightarrow from one cycle to two cycles (BA/MA with ECTS)
 - national qualification framework
 - development of the quality assurance system
 - \rightarrow compulsory accreditation
