Digital QA processes

This WP focusses on digital QA processes in QA agencies.

The survey was sent out, deadline June 9:

Survey "on the impact of digital transformation on quality assurance processes,

the internal operations of quality assurance agencies and

on ways of data management and sharing"

Exploring the degree of digitalisation of QA processes: data management, data sharing and COVID impact on QA agencies, including proposed directions of action.
