

THE SORBONNE

On 23 May we will celebrate the 20th anniversary of the **Sorbonne Declaration**, the foundation stone of the EHEA.


The **Sorbonne** is one of the oldest and most famous universities of the world. Founded in 1253 by Robert de Sorbon, Chaplain of King Louis IX, it is the historical seat of the University of Paris.

The building today houses the *Rectorat d'Académie* (education authority of Paris), the *Chancellerie des Universités de Paris* and several higher education and research institutions.

It is in this historical building that the **Sorbonne Declaration** was signed in 1998, by the ministers of four countries, namely France, Germany, UK and Italy. The aim of the Declaration was to create a common frame of reference within the intended European Higher Education Area, where mobility should be promoted both for students and graduates, as well as for the teaching staff. Another important goal was to ensure the promotion of qualifications with regard to the job market.
